

TRAVEL RESPONSIBLY

- AVOID TRAILS THAT ARE WET AND MUDDY.
- RIDE IN THE MIDDLE OF THE TRAILS TO MINIMIZE WIDENING.
- AVOID SIDE-SLIPPING, WHICH CAN LEAD TO EROSION AND EFFECT WATER QUALITY.
- COMPLY WITH ALL SIGNS AND RESPECT BARRIERS.

RESPECT THE RIGHTS OF OTHERS

- IF CROSSING PRIVATE PROPERTY, BE SURE TO ASK PERMISSION FROM THE LANDOWNER(S) AND LEAVE GATES AS YOU FIND THEM.
- YIELD THE RIGHT OF WAY TO THOSE PASSING YOU OR TRAVELING UPHILL.

- OBTAIN A MAP OF YOUR DESTINATION AND DETERMINE WHICH AREAS ARE OPEN TO MOUNTAIN BIKES.

EDUCATE

- E-BIKES ARE MANAGED DIFFERENTLY BY AGENCY. ALWAYS CHECK WITH THE LAND MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO ENSURE YOU ARE ON A ROUTE DESIGNATED FOR E-BIKE USE.
- CHECK THE WEATHER FORECAST BEFORE YOU GO.
- WEAR A HELMET. EYE PROTECTION. AND OTHER SAFETY GEAR.



- SENSITIVE HABITATS TO AVOID INCLUDE MEADOWS, LAKESHORES, WETLANDS, CRYPTOBIOTIC SOILS, **TUNDRA AND SEASONAL NESTING** OR BREEDING AREAS.

- AVOID DISTURBING HISTORICAL. ARCHAEOLOGICAL OR PALEONTOLOGICAL SITES.



- PACK OUT WHAT YOU PACK IN.
- CARRY A TRASH BAG AND PICK UP LITTER LEFT BY OTHERS.
