RESPECT THE RIGHTS OF OTHERS

- RIDE SINGLE FILE.
- KEEP TO THE RIGHT AND PASS ON THE LEFT ONLY WHEN TRAIL IS CLEAR.
- YIELD THE RIGHT-OF-WAY TO SKIERS, SNOWSHOERS AND THOSE PASSING OR TRAVELING UPHILL.



 IF CROSSING PRIVATE PROPERTY, ALWAYS ASK PERMISSION FROM LANDOWNERS. - ALWAYS CHECK THE WEATHER AND AVALANCHE CONDITIONS.

E DUCATE YOURSELF

- WEAR SAFETY GEAR SUCH
 AS GOGGLES, HELMET AND WATERPROOF LAYERS.
- WHILE RIDING WATCH FOR SIGNS OF HYPOTHERMIA.
- TAKE A SKILLS COURSE KNOW HOW TO SAFELY OPERATE YOUR MACHINE AND EQUIPMENT.



A VOID SENSITIVE AREAS

- LOW SNOW, DON'T GO.
- A SNOWMOBILE'S SPINNING TRACKS DAMAGE PLANTS AND SOIL BELOW THE SNOW'S SURFACE.
- BE RESPECTFUL OF WILDLIFE'S WINTERING HABITATS.



- REMEMBER, MOTORIZED VEHICLES AREN'T ALLOWED IN FEDERALLY DESIGNATED WILDERNESS AREAS.
