
STEP 1: GET A SHEET OF PAPER.






STEP 3: CUT OFF THE BOTTOM RECTANGLE.




STEP 4: OPEN THE PIECE OF PAPER.




STEP 5: FOLD THE PAPER CORNER TO CORNER THE OTHER WAY AND OPEN IT BACK UP. YOU SHOULD HAVE AN X FROM CORNERS TO CORNERS, MEETING IN THE MIDDLE OF THE PAPER.






STEP 6: FOLD THE TOP HALF BACK SO THE EDGES MEET. UNFOLD THE PAPER.




STEP 7: POKE THE CENTER OF THE PAPER WITH YOUR FINGER AND BRING THE SIDES TOGETHER SO IT MAKES A TRIANGLE.



STEP 8: ROTATE THE TRIANGLE SIDEWAYS.



STEP 9: FOLD THE BOTTOM CORNER UP TO MAKE HALF OF THE TAIL.





STEP 10: FOLD THE TOP CORNER DOWN TO MAKE THE OTHER HALF OF THE TAIL.




STEP 11: TURN OVER YOUR FINISHED ORIGAMI FISH.

STEP 12: DRAW A FUNNY EYE, GILLS, AND OTHER CREATIVE ADDITIONS.






